

The Golden Rule: Bar Graph

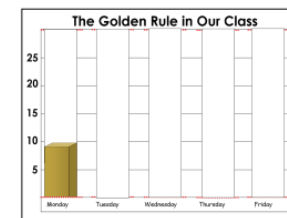
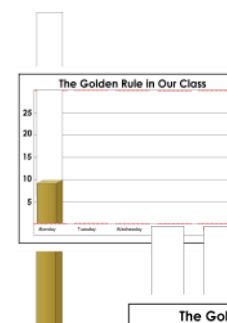
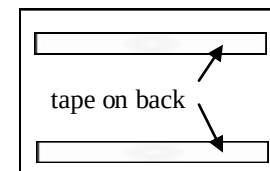
Students will observe behaviors in the classroom and on the playground. They will add a tally mark to a chart on the white board whenever someone's behavior follows the guidelines of the Golden Rule. At the end of each day they will count the tally marks and record the information on a bar graph.

Preparation:

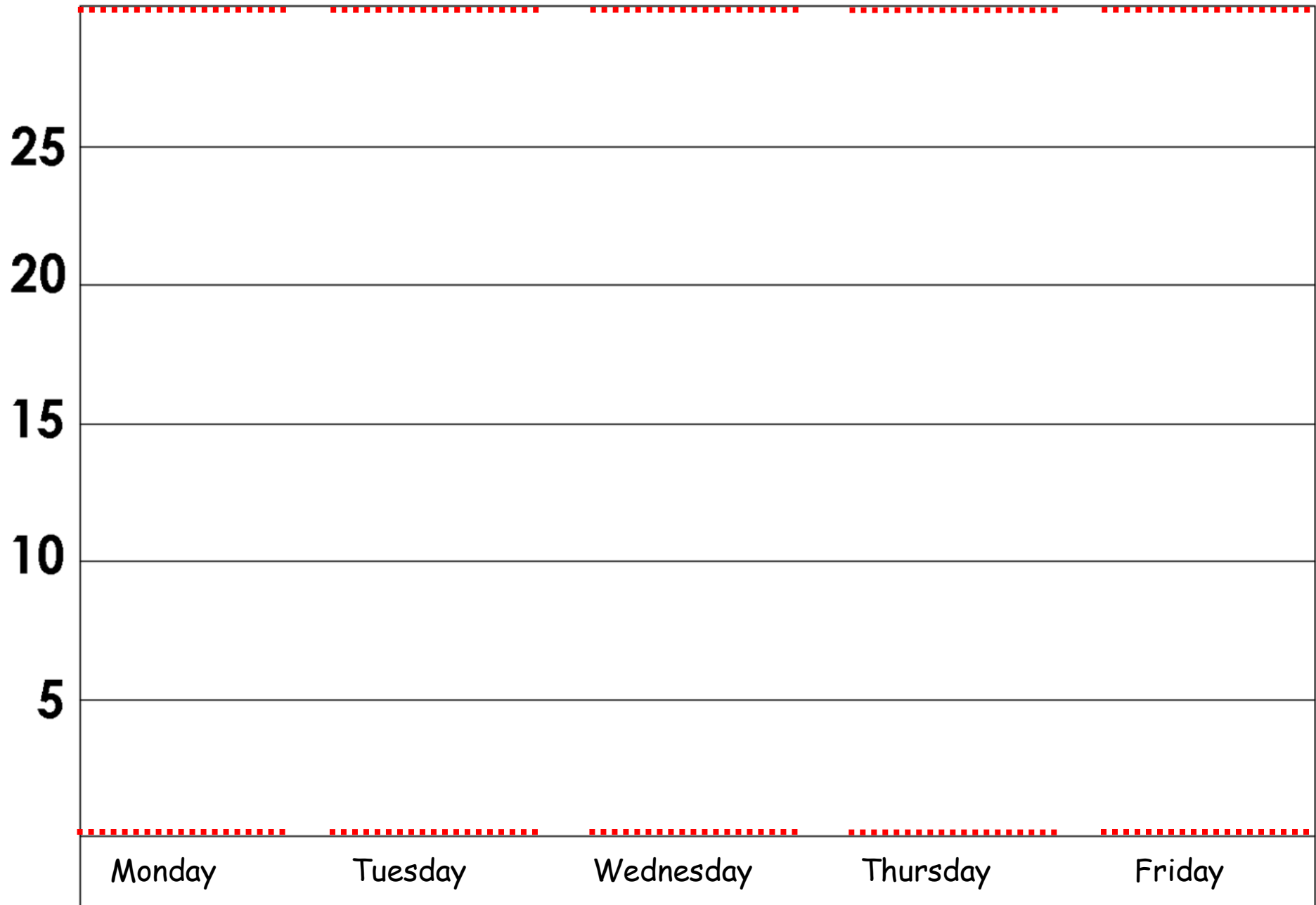
1. If you want to physically record the information on the graph with markers or crayons, use the graph on page 4 and run off as many copies as you want to use on copy paper.

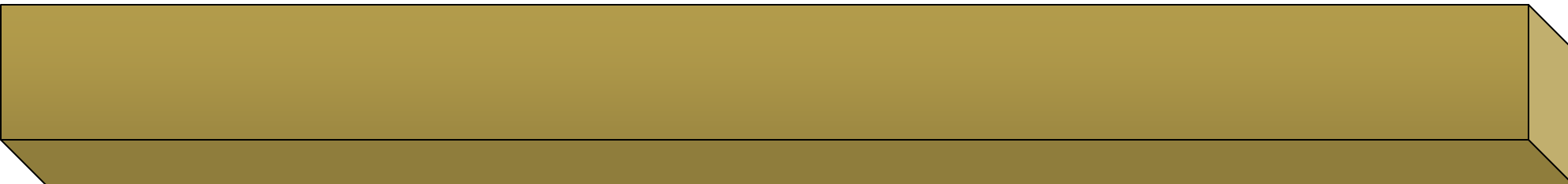
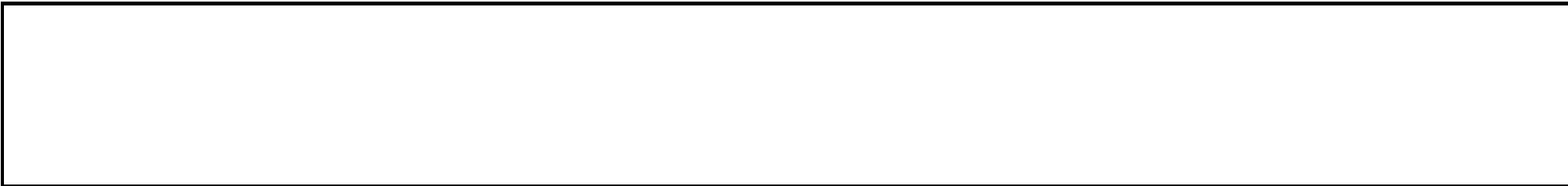
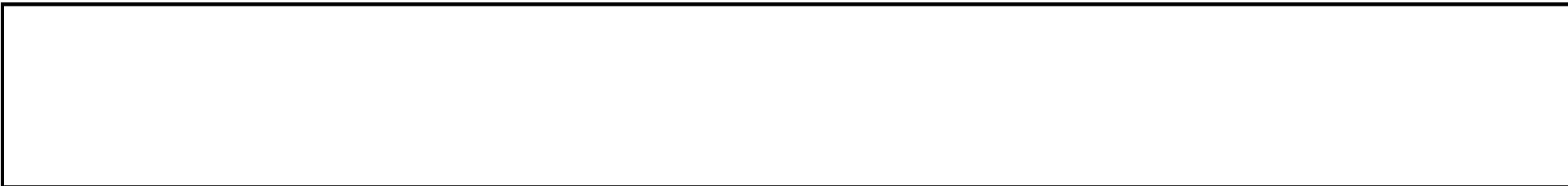
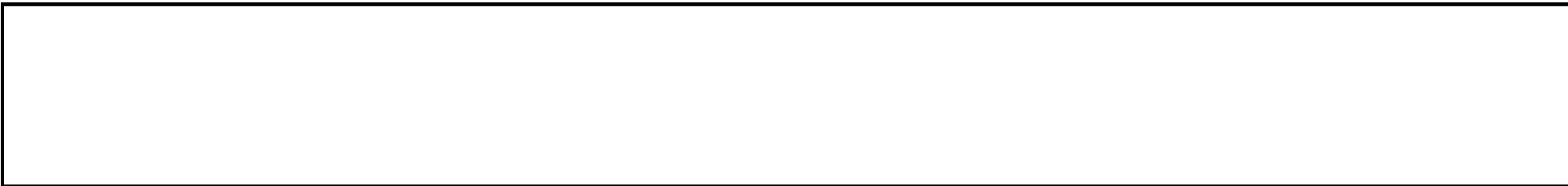
To make a bar graph with adjustable bars:

1. Print page 2 on photo paper (for best results), cover stock, or heavy white drawing paper.
2. Print page 3 on photo paper (for best results), cover stock, or heavy white drawing paper. Make 2 copies of page 3.
3. Place a row of tape on the BACK of the bar graph to stretch across the top and bottom where the dotted red lines are. This will reinforce the area that will get a lot of action.
4. Cut out the bars and white strips on page 3. Glue or tape them together in strips. You'll need 5 of them.
5. Laminate the bar graph and the strips, and then trim off the lamin.
6. Cut slits on the front of the bar graph using a box cutter or xacto knife to trace over the red dotted lines. Be sure to leave at least a quarter of an inch between cuts.
7. Thread the bars through the slots so you can slide them up or down to "mark" the graph.
8. Staple the ends of the strips together on the back to make a loop that slides.
9. Adjust the bars so that only the white section shows. Move a strip each day to record the information from the tally marks.
